

DOUGLAS WALTER McBRIEN MEMORIAL BURSARY

Douglas Walter McBrien was born in Amherst June 7, 1964, son of Mrs. Marie (Newcombe) McBrien and the late John Joseph McBrien. On the death of his father in July 1965 he and his mother moved to Brookdale. He attended Brookdale Elementary School and was a former member of the 1st Fenwick Cub Pack. On completion of Elementary School he attended St. Charles and Amherst Regional High Schools in Amherst. He was keenly interested in track and field and had participated in different track meets. He was also interested in photography. He received the Lieutenant Governor's Medal in grade 11, June 1981 and graduated in 1982, with a bursary to Dalhousie and the Gerald Tingley Memorial Scholarship. He had completed his first year of pre-med studies at Dalhousie University, Halifax in April 1983.

While walking home from work on May 20, 1983, he was killed by a car near his home on the Gould Road.

CONDITIONS:

1. The bursary shall be awarded to a graduating student.
2. The student must attend Dalhousie University – preferably enrolled in Pre-medicine.
3. The student must have good academic standing.
4. The amount of the bursary is \$500.
5. Consideration shall be given to individual financial circumstances.
6. Consideration shall be given to strength of character and ability to work with others.
7. Half of the bursary shall be awarded upon registration at Dalhousie and half at the beginning of the second term.
